# Jobless rate declines

## Huntington County reports unemployment at 9.1 percent

The Indiana Department of Workforce has released the unemployment report covering the period July 11 through August 10 (the August Unemployment Report). Huntington County's unemployment rate was reported at 9.1 percent, a

slight improvement from July's 9.2 percent and a more significant improvement from last year's report of 11 percent.

Considering national trends, this is encouraging news, said Mark Wickersham, Executive Director of Huntington County Economic Development.

"The Obama administration, in releasing these numbers earlier in the month, reported that nationally there were no net new jobs created," he said. "In Huntington County, our unemployment rate actually dropped

slightly, not significantly, but it dropped a little bit. Of course to have any sort of positive change in a situation where nationally there were no net new jobs created, that's actually a pretty good report."

According to the report, of the 19,031 people in Huntington County's labor force, 1,723 are unemployed. However, Wickersham said several of the county's major industrial employers are still looking to hire people.

"There's a little bit of a problem matching the

workforce skills that are available with the requirements of positions that are available," he said.

He said there are quite a bit of workforce development and training programs being conducted by the state to help employers and job seekers.

Besides the unemployment rate, Wickersham said there are other signs of economic improvement in the community.

"We've had nine industrial project announcements this calendar year so far and another 12 retail and small

commercial announcements coordinated through the chamber," he said.

Wickersham added that there is obviously still a lot of work to do. At 9.1 percent, the unemployment rate is higher than the state average of 8.7 percent. Huntington County has the 36th highest unemployment rate of the state's 92 counties.

"Huntington continues to show signs of bucking the national trend, but we're still a long way from what anyone would call a full recovery," he said.
