

Two-EE's gets big honors at Indy contest

Two-EE's Winery's Traminette was awarded "Indiana Traminette of the Year" at the 2016 Indy International Wine Competition, held Aug. 3 and 4.

With more than 2,000 entries from 11 countries and 40 U.S. states, the Indy International Wine Competition is the country's largest independent wine contest.

"Traminette is Indiana's state grape; we're proud to have taken this Hoosier-grown varietal and turned it into something unique," says Two-EE's co-owner Eric Harris. "To be recognized and awarded by our peers reaffirms our belief that Indiana wineries have just as much to offer as those from Napa Valley and New York, and even those from Europe, South America and Australia."

Two-EE's was also chosen best in class for their Norton; double gold for their Cabernet Sauvignon, Tannat and regional favorite, Plonque. Other Two-EE's wines taking home awards were Pear, Dia-

mond, Gruner Veltliner, White Sangria, Plum, Barreja, Blackberry, and Catawba. Collectively, these wines represent the majority of Two-EE's offerings.
